Softball: Union clinches No. 2 seed in upcoming Region 8-AA Tournament

Lady Panthers to host Senior Night ceremony following Tuesday's region finale vs Rabun

After going hitless in a 1-0 loss to Banks County in the de facto Region 8-AA title game, the Union County Lady Panthers bounced back with a 6-1 victory at Oglethorpe County to lockdown second place in 8-AA's final regular season standings.

As a result, the Lady Panthers will host No. 7 seed Putnam County (1-12, 0-5) in the opening round of the Region 8-AA Tournament. The winner will secure a spot in the Class AA State Tournament

Entering last Thursday's contest with Oglethorpe County, the Lady Patriots were only one game back of second place Union County and jumped out to an early 1-0 lead.

Still reeling from a gutwrenching loss to Banks County, the Lady Panthers got off to a slow start, stranding five runners over the first three innings.

Defensively, two errors in the bottom half of the third allowed Oglethorpe to grab the lead on a sacrifice fly. Senior Megan Bright would pitch around a walk and an error in the fourth and a hit batter in the fifth as she waited for the bats to come to life.

Union County finally awoke with six runs in the sixth tage.



as they sent 11 hitters to the plate during the inning.

Three-straight one-out singles by Rebekah Kelley, Emma Roxbury and Aubrie Banton tied the game at 1-1.

Leading 7-6 early, 21-14 in the second and 24-14 in the third, the Panthers never put away the Hurricanes until back-to-back touchdown runs by Daniel and Chad Buzzard made it 38-14 in the fourth.

Pierson Allison recovered from his first interception of the season to throw for 284 yards on 19-of-28. He also ran for a career-high 135 yards and two scores on 13 attempts.

Meanwhile, Daniel and Buzzard combined for 134 yards and three scores on 24 carries. Drake had six grabs for 91 yards; Rich finished with 71

yards on three catches.

The Hurricanes' offense finished with 207 rushing yards on 6.1 yards per carry. They also completed 13-of-22 passes for 203 yards, two scores and a pick

However, starting quarterback Jaymerious Fleetwood (203 passing, 105 rushing yards last year vs Union) graduated, as did running backs Dylan Jackson (89 yards vs UC) and Chance Hope (13 yards).

This year's squad is led by senior running back Jaylon Mitchell (91 yards per game) and senior quarterback Matt Cain, who currently sports a 39% completion percentage with three interceptions and no touchdowns while averaging 69 passing yards a game.

Others to watch are sophomore running backs Keyshawn Ammons, who's averaging an explosive 14 yards per carry, and Shamarion Green, who is putting up 30 YPG on the ground and 29 yards per kickoff

Junior Graeme Williams leads the team with three catches, while seniors Jordan and Jaylon Mitchell have two grabs apiece

"They are big, physical

and athletic," Coach Allison said when asked what concerned him about this week's opponent. We're going to have to do a much better job of tackling than we did down there last year.

'We had a hard time tackling their quarterback and we threw an early interception. We're going to have to fix all that and I expect it to be another battle.'

Monticello is coming off a 28-21 loss to Class A's 8th ranked North Cobb Christian. The week before they surrendered 24-unanswered at Bowdon after taking a 7-0 lead into the second quarter.

In the opener, Mount de Sales handled the Canes, 35-6. On the season, Monticello's three opponents have a combined record of 8-0, so it's safe to say they're much better than their 0-3 record might indicate.

"They graduated their quarterback but they have another good one this year," Coach Allison said. "They also have a couple pretty good running backs, so we're going to have our hands full."
