services and facilities at the absolutely lowest possible cost. Keeping that goal in mind, we always evaluate all our expenses and how they might impact our property taxes. If we are considering the need for a new employee, we carefully evaluate the real need. Obviously SPLOST really assists us in our goal to keep property taxes as low as possible.

Q. When you tell us that we have one of the lowest property tax rates in the State of Georgia, what does that really mean?

A. First, there are 159 counties in Georgia and they all have property taxes, based on a "mil" rate. As of this listing and based on the information we collect from the state. Union County government has the SECOND lowest mil rate of any other county in the entire state of Georgia. Union County School system has the 6th lowest mil rate in the state of Georgia and combined (county and school), we have the third lowest

Q. How does the property tax rate convert into property taxes paid?

A. It is fairly complicated, and there are many variables. Your property taxes here and in any county in the state are based on their assessed value (40% of market value). Therefore, if you have property in a county with low proper values, such as in South Georgia, then of course your taxes per acre will be lower than in a county in the north part of the state or near a large metro area where property values are higher. However, since the vast majority of people who pay property taxes do it on their home, there is not such a large difference in values for homes unless your home is on a lakefront property or some other commercial or high value property.

Q. Can you give some examples of home property tax values from different counties with higher mil rates than Union County?

A. Yes, I will. However, certain counties may have different exemptions of property and these numbers are based on a new home with no exemptions. The examples below are for county property taxes only, and do not include the school taxes.

Based on a \$200,000 home x 40 % (assessed value) would be taxed at \$80,000.

Union County taxes \$462.88; Rabun County taxes \$729.60; Lumpkin County taxes \$1,088.32; Clayton County taxes - \$1,727.68.

Appropriate dosing is also included in the instructions for every prescription or over-the-counter medication. This ensures the side effects of the medication do not outweigh the benefits. Medical marijuana

has no standard dosing instruc-

Because of this lack of testing and production standards, every plant, every oil, and every edible could have a different amount of the active cannabinoids that seem to relieve some disease symptoms. How can you be sure of what you are getting? If it works one time, how can you be sure to get the same dosage next time?

In addition, the marijuana available today is very different from years ago. THC, the psychoactive chemical in marijuana, is three times stronger today than 20-30 years ago. Conversely, cannabidiol (CBD), the nonintoxicating element that shows therapeutic and anti-psychotic value, has decreased almost at the same rate.

According to a study conducted by Ryan Vandrey, Ph.D. of the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, only 17% of the packaged edibles he studied were accurately labeled.

A study by Dr. Joseph Tuscano of the University of California, Davis Cancer Center found that a majority of the medical marijuana samples he

looked at were contaminated with dangerous bacteria and fungi. Will the marijuana industry be required, like Big Tobacco and Big Pharma, to compensate people who get sick from their product?

Yes, part of the problem is that marijuana is still categorized as a Schedule I substance, which means there are so many restrictions that scientists have been unable to conduct rigorous research. But the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine looked at more than 10,000 studies that were conducted and found no solid, conclusive evidence that marijuana is safe to be used as a medication.

While patients will now have the opportunity to try this experimental drug, it's employers who will be the real lab rats. Ever since Nancy Reagan started telling kids to "Just Say No" to drugs, employers have been doing the same. Zero tolerance policies have become the norm. There are some cases working their way through the courts that seek to give the protections of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) to medical marijuana users, but nothing has changed yet.

It is essential for employers to know that, at least for now, marijuana is still illegal on the federal level. That means you are perfectly within your right to demand a drugfree workplace.

Zone 1 - 5 ft. around the perimeter. The objective of this zone is to reduce the chance of wind-blown embers from a nearby fire landing near the home, igniting combustible debris or materials and exposing the home to flames. This zone is closest to the house, so it requires the most careful selection and management of vegetation and other materials.

Zone 2-30 ft. around the perimeter (or to the property line) The objective of this zone is to create and maintain a landscape that, if ignited, will not readily transmit fire to the home. Trees and shrubs in this zone should be in well-spaced groupings and well maintained. Ladder fuels (i.e., shorter vegetation or shrubs under taller trees) should be avoided to prevent the fire from climbing into

you can take a cutting to propagate your own tree. Cuttings should be made from one year old wood and should be about eight to ten inches long. If you already have a fig tree and it is not producing, there could be a few reasons. Figs take several years to mature and bear fruit, and dry hot weather can make them take even longer.

Lon and Laura married one another and raised their children (one of which was my grandfather) there on the home place. Lon took his family to church every Sunday and even played the pump organ for Sunday services.

Uncle Riley and Will raised their family on farms as well. These two men developed quite the reputation for being tough and stern minded. Uncle Riley was attacked by a man with a knife in Russellville and experienced having his lower abdomen sliced open. A doctor placed the intestines back into his abdomen and sewed him up without the aid of antiseptics or painkillers.

Late in his life, Uncle Will had a misunderstanding with the Alabama Department of Transportation. A new road was being built in front of his house. Something happened that Will did not like and he told the workers to leave or he would shoot them. They laughed at him. to be ignited by wind-blown embers, the resulting fire should not be able to threaten the home by a radiant heat exposure or by flames being able to touch the exterior surfaces of your home. Zone 3 - 100 ft. (or to the

property line). The objective of vegetation management in this zone is to reduce the energy and speed of the wildfire. Tree and brush spacing should force the fire in the tops of the tree, brush, or shrub crowns to drop to the ground. Flame length should decrease.
