## February is Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month

Teen Dating Violence impacts everyone, not just teens. Parents, siblings, friends, and our community are all effected. Together, we can raise awareness and promote safety among our teen population.

It is estimated 1 in 10 teens, ages 12-19 experience dating violence. Nationwide the same age group experience the highest rates of rape and sexual assault. Girls are particularly vul-

nerable to experiencing violence in a relationship and are most likely to suffer long term behavior and health consequences, such as attempted suicide, eating disorders and drug abuse. A recent study pub-

lished by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention says that within a year 21% of high school girls and 10% of high school boys were physically or sexually assaulted by someone they dated. Additionally, we often hear about the harmful impacts of physical or sexual abuse in a relationship, but less often we hear about emotional or verbal abuse behaviors used to manipulate and control a dating partner. They range from manipulation and humiliation to extreme jealousy and possessive behaviors.

Be aware of the warning signs that include: sudden changes in behavior from explosive temper and/or mood swings to increased insecurity and isolation from family and friends, just to name a few. Someone experiencing teen dating violence may feel they have no one to turn to when they need it the most. Recognize these early warning signs. The Justice Department Research also shows that school level interventions reduce dating violence up to 50%.
