Union County Sheriff's Deputies arrested a man last week following an early morning crime spree in the vicinity of Worley's Tires on Murphy Highway, UCSO Lt. Daren Osborn said. Billy Joe Elkins Jr.,

36, of Morganton, was taken into custody around 7 a.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 9, and charged with theft by taking, entering auto, first degree burglary, second degree burglary, disorderly conduct, loitering, and probation violation for a prior drug conviction. Authorities aren't sure

how Elkins came to be in the area that morning, and he reports not being able to come in until around 6:30 a.m.,

remember, but the alleged criminal activity began around 3 a.m. when a man living on Harkins Young Road got up for work and saw his floodlight activate, Osborn said.

The homeowner went outside to see what made the light turn on and witnessed Elkins entering his vehicle before scaring the intruder off, Osborn said. At some point over the

next three and a half hours, Osborn said Elkins managed to take a motorcycle from one residence, which passing motorists later reported seeing him pushing down Murphy Highway, and a TV plus two duffle bags filled with items stolen from another home. The first 911 call didn't
