BOE hears about school safety, welcomes guests

School safety is a hot national topic right now in the aftermath of the Valentine's Day school shooting in Parkland, Florida.

So, it came as no surprise that Union County Schools Superintendent Dr. Fred Rayfield addressed the issue of school safety in the Feb. 20 work session of the Union County Board of Education.

The schools have resource officers, security guards, cameras, emergency panic buttons, buzz-in doors, a safety plan approved by the Georgia Emergency Management Agency and other security measures, according to Dr. Řayfield.

And as previously reported, the system regularly partners with local first responders, from the sheriff's office to police and fire, to conduct walkthroughs to keep law enforcement officials apprised of school layouts.

The school board met for its regular monthly meeting later that evening, and board members welcomed several special guests. "It's always a good

night when you get to recognize students and their accomplishments," said Dr. Rayfield. "For the past two years in the primary school, we've been working with the art teacher there that has really done a good job of getting our students to put together some ideas for our system Christmas

Second-grader Emma Taylor's design was selected to grace the front of the school

system's 2017 Christmas card. and she attended the February board meeting with her mom, dad and siblings. "This was sent out to our

mailing list of everybody that gets Christmas cards from the board of education," said Dr. Rayfield, who then turned to Emma. "We're going to present you with a framed copy of it, and thank you for a beautiful piece of artwork."

Emma's particularly festive artwork featured an ornamental Christmas tree hanging on a real Christmas tree, and her art teacher was Jane Edison. Also in the meeting,

the board recognized another member of the community with a "Partner in Education Award."

The Blairsville-Union County Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors has hired Al Harper to serve as chamber president.

Harper has led the chamber in an interim capacity since the start of 2018, following the resignation of Regina Allison as chamber president in December.

The board asked Harper in December if he would help the chamber bridge the gap in leadership during the search for a new chamber president, and his interest in helming the chamber grew right alongside the board's interest in bringing him on as a permanent replacement.

He learned on Tuesday. Feb. 20, that the board had decided to hire him out of all the candidates interviewed, and Harper has pledged to maintain the leadership style that won over the board.

"The chamber of commerce is a small business serving small businesses," said Harper. "There's no magic to running it if you run it like a small business. The members are our customers, and we either serve them properly or we don't. If we don't do it properly, we lose business."

With multiple business startups under his belt and corporate work experience with companies like IBM and
