# Weekend slump dooms Panthers in low-scoring losses to Pepperell, Heard County

Union County began week two of the 2021 baseball season with victories over Gilmer and Fannin before dropping a pair of pitchers' duels to Pepperell and Heard County over the weekend.

The Panthers will face Dawson County (twice) and Chestatee this week in their final tune-ups before Region 8-AA action gets underway.

Panthers 7, Gilmer 6 (10 innings) - The week got underway on Monday, Feb. 22 with an extra-inning thriller vs. Gilmer that ended on Damien Chitwood's walkdouble in the 10th.

However, the late-inning drama wasn't limited to the 10th as Union needed runs in the fourth, sixth and seventh to overcome a 5-2 deficit and force extras. And following two quiet frames in the eighth and ninth, Gilmer broke the 5-5 tie with a run in the top half of the 10th, setting the table for Chitwood's

With two down and the tying run at first, Union County's back was firmly against the wall in the 10th. But Zeke Swartz would represent the winning run after he was hit by a pitch, putting two aboard for Chitwood. And the Panthers' senior clean-up hitter wasted no time, jumping on the first pitch from Gilmer's Gabe Wolfson and launching a two-run double into centerfield, scoring Swartz and Thomas Dyer.

Chitwood finished his night 3 for 6 with 2 RBIs and two doubles. Dyer went 3 for 5 with 2 RBIs and a run. Senior Isaak Mullinack doubled and scored three times during a 3-for-5 performance.

Tyler Loyd picked up his first win of the year, working five innings in relief, striking out three while allowing two hits, two walks and one earned run.

Excluding a leadoff double in the 10th that resulted in a run, Tyler Loyd held the Bobcats in check after replacing Dyer in the sixth inning. As a result, the Panthers were able to erase a 5-3 sixth-inning deficit, beginning with an RBI single by Dyer after Mullinack kept the inning alive with a two-out

Union County struck again with two outs when Conner Shields reached on Loyd's opposite-field single a run and an RBI. put runners at the corners in the seventh. With the tying run 90-feet away, junior pinchhitter Christopher Fletcher stepped out of the dugout and delivered an RBI single to right field.

The Panthers opened the scoring in the first inning when Swartz doubled home Mullinack, who led off with a walk. But Chitwood, who got the start on the mound, ran into trouble in the second via a single, a walk, a fielding error and three balks that aided Gilmer in securing a 2-1 advantage.

In the bottom half of the inning, a Bobcat miscue allowed Union to even the score

Following two walks to begin the third, Chitwood was replaced by Dyer, who hit a batter and gave up a run-scoring wild pitch. The Bobcats pushed the lead to 5-2 in the fourth courtesy of a one-out RBI double and a runscoring fielder's choice.

The Panthers manufactured a two-out run in their half of the inning when Mullinack singled and stole second, allowing Dyer to make it 5-3 with a base hit to left.

Dyer surrendered four hits and two runs over three innings on the hill, fanning two and walking one. Chitwood worked two-plus innings in the start, giving up two earned, three walks and one hit while striking out

Swartz finished 1 for 4 at the plate with an RBI, a double and a run. Shields walked and scored twice; Bailey Brown also drew two

Panthers 7, No. 3 Fannin County - Union County blanked third-ranked Fannin County for the second time in two weeks, leaving Blue Ridge with a 7-0 shutout victory on Wednesday.
