I.T. Harkins' new home springs from the ashes

As I.T. Harkins sat at his dinner table one Sunday evening in October 2016, he heard a peculiar sound coming from the kitchen. "I had just finished

my meal, and I hear the refrigerator - POP-POP-POP-POP – banging loud as a shotgun," said Harkins.

The 97-year-old Suches resident jumped up and rushed to his fridge, only to find nothing the matter with it. Where was the sound coming from?

Harkins turned his attention to the adjoining garage, and when he opened the door, he was hit with a wall of heat.

He realized then that his home of more than three decades was burning

"I got rid of that door right quick and ran out the front door, and the same thing happened," said Harkins.

The fire had spread into the attic of his home, and flames rolled out of the vents in his roof and into the night air overhead as he escaped to safety

Harkins couldn't call for help because his phone was inside the burning home, so he took up his garden hose to wet the grass around the house in an effort to contain the blaze.

"I can't express how I

felt," said Harkins, looking back on the night of the fire. "A lot of stuff we'd had for years, and it was slow-motion burning. I'd never had a feeling like that in my life, but yet I had to face it.

As Harkins fought the fire, passersby leaving the evening service of the nearby Corinth Baptist Church came to his aid and called 911.

By the time firefighters extinguished the blaze, Harkins' home had suffered enough damage that it needed to be rebuilt from the ground up, and many of his belongings had either burned or sustained significant damage from water and smoke.

Union County volunteers just finished their C.E.R.T. training and are ready to aid the community in the event of a natural disaster.

"We're really proud of our team, they worked really hard," said Union County Fire Chief David Dyer. "They're

volunteers, and we really appreciate the time they put in to help our community.

C.E.R.T. stands for Community Emergency Response Team and is a program that was developed and implemented by the Los Angeles City Fire Department in 1985, where they recognized that most citizens would be on their own in the event of a

catastrophe.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency, or FEMA, found the program to be so beneficial that the federal agency made it available to communities nationwide.

That's how FEMA came to assist counties with grants to help cover some of the cost to run the C.E.R.T. training

Mickey Cummings has decided to qualify as a Republican candidate for state representative in the Georgia House District 8 race.

As such, he will not seek re-election to the Blue Ridge Mountain EMC Board of Directors in September.

Cummings is in the third and final year of his first term on the EMC board, and he has served as board president for the last year and a half.

"Regarding the EMC position, I just want people running for that again," said Cummings. "You can't do both jobs at one time. I don't think there's a way.

"I want people to know that seat is going to be empty, so we need some good quality candidates to step up to the plate.'

The EMC director seats held by Roy Perren of Towns County and Larry Williams of Fannin County will also be up for election this year.

EMC elections take place in the summer and results are announced in the annual
