
Golf: Panthers take two from Towns County, split with Hayesville

The Union County guys were victorious over Hayesville on Monday at Butternut Creek Golf Course by a score of 197-225. Track: Allison and Hartzog lead the charge at Habersham Central

Mt.Airy - Union County track and field recorded eight top-three finishes last Friday at Habersham Central's Battle of the Blue Ridge. Headlining Union's day

was a pair of first-place performances by Riley Allison and Hunter Hartzog, along with a second-place finish by Hana Allison cleared 4-feet, 10

inches to take home first in the girls' high jump event. Hartzog clocked in at 2 minutes, 5.24 seconds to place first in the boys' 800-meter race.

In the girls' 800M, Gregory came in second with a time of 2:38.34. She also placed third in the 1600M, crossing the finish line at 6:10.89.

Other top-three finishes for Union County included Elliot Stepps in the boys' 200M with a time of 23.80, and Zander Rotko in the boys 400M at 53.16. Noah Underwood was third in the boys' discus throw with a distance in the 1600M, clocking in at

Union's other top-10 Sixth-place finishers competitors were Daniel Griggs in the boys' high jump. Luke Miller in the boys' 300 hurdles, Hunter Payne in the 3200M, Wright in the triple jump and Abercrombie in the long jump.

between the second and fourth with two in the bottom half of innings to quickly erase a 1-0 deficit and run away from Union County in game three of the Region 8-AA series.

In the nightcap of Friday's doubleheader at Banks County High School, Hughes was awarded his second start of the series, but lasted just 3 innings, allowing 6 hits, 6 earned runs, 4 walks and 2 hit batters.

Dyer worked 2/3 of an inning in relief, giving up 3 earned runs, 3 hits, 2 hit batters and one walk. Mullanack worked the final 1 2/3, allowing 5 hits and 2 earned runs.

The Panthers manufactured the run when Hughes reached on a one-out walk and Mullanack joined him with a two-out base on balls. Hughes was held at third on Swartz's single to left, loading the bags for Chitwood, who picked up the ribby on a five-pitch walk.

Banks County answered

the frame, then tacked on four more in the fourth to open up a 10-2 lead. Leading 11-2 in the bottom of the sixth, the Leopards ended the game via the mercy rule when a basesloaded walk stretched their margin to 10 runs.

Up next: After taking on two of the top-9 teams in Class AA, the Panthers will face Riverside Military Academy in a battle of the only winless teams in Region 8-AA. Since it's very likely the final two playoff spots in 8-AA will be determined by Union (0-6), Riverside (0-6) and Rabun County (3-3), the Panthers need to make a stand this week by locking down a state playoff berth.

Riverside recently suffered three one-sided losses to Rabun County by a combined score of 41-8. So, at minimum, Union County needs two wins over RMA to secure a playoff spot, and a sweep to keep pace with third-place Rabun - who faces No. 8 Elbert County (15-4, 6-0) this week. This week's action got

Trailing 4-1 in the third underway Monday with a non-region matchup at Towns County (5-9). The Panthers resume region play Tuesday with a trip to Riverside at 5:55 p.m. The series concludes Thursday with a 5 p.m. doubleheader in Blairsville.

Union County's Senior Night is scheduled for Friday, April 9 when the Panthers wrap up the Region 8-AA schedule with a doubleheader vs. Rabun County.
