

No. 4 Panthers' visit to Dawson County ends in 1-1 draw

Crawford, McCarter lead the charge in Lady Panthers' win over MACA

The No. 4 Panthers left Class AAA Dawson County on Tuesday, March 26 with a 1-1 tie courtesy of junior Antonio Solorio's early goal.

During the opening minutes, senior Zuriel Mancillas found Solorio for a 1-0 Union County lead, but Dawson County answered with the equalizer in the fifth.

Neither team found the net over the next 75 minutes of a physical contest on a rainy night in Dawsonville.

Earlier, the Lady Panthers suffered a 9-0 loss to No. 6 Dawson County, giving up five goals in the first 40 minutes.

Union County bounced back with a win over Mountain Area Christian Academy (MACA) on Thursday, March 28.

The Lady Panthers scored 10 goals during the first half for a 10-0 victory.

Senior Zoe Crawford opened the scoring when she turned a MACA goal kick into the day's first point during the 2nd minute. Junior Ariel McCarter found the net in the sixth courtesy of Crawford, then junior Lily Brookshire added an unassisted goal in the eighth for a 3-0 lead.

McCarter's second goal came in the 11th via Crawford. Junior Katelyn Brown scored in the 17th for a 5-0 lead; senior Marina Stepps added another in the 26th.

Sophomore Chanda Gray bumped the lead to 7-0 in the 33rd; senior Allana and Crawford rounded out the scoring in the 39th.

Athens Academy silences Union Co. bats in three-game sweep Panthers to host Providence Christian in Saturday doubleheader

Union County dropped to fifth place in Region 8-AA following a three-game sweep at the hands of Athens Academy

The Panthers (5-9, 2-5) suffered a 12-1 home loss in Wednesday's opener before losing two in Athens on Friday night, 4-0 and 11-0.

Union County returns to the diamond on Saturday, April 6, when they host Providence Christian in a doubleheader rescheduled from March 22.

Panthers 1, Athens Academy 12 (Gm 1) - The Spartans scored the first dozen runs to build a 12-0 lead in the fifth. Union County pushed across one in the bottom half, but it wasn't enough to continue as the mercy rule ended things after five.

Sophomore Gunnar Akins started for the Panthers, giving up 6 runs (four earned) and 5 hits over 3+ innings. The Union lefty struck out five, walked two and hit a batter.

Union County manufactured only one run on 8 hits and a pair of walks. Senior Will Doyle and sophomore Lane Haney logged two hits apiece, with Haney driving in the lone run via a fifth-inning single

Athens pushed across one in the first courtesy of a leadoff single, a wild pitch and a blooper into shallow right field.

Two Union errors and two hits extended the Spartans' lead to 4-0 in the second. The Panthers stranded two runners in the bottom half after Doyle singled to left-center and Akins drew a walk.

An Athens Academy double and a sacrifice fly made it 5-0 in the third, but Union loaded the bases before a popup ended the inning.

Akins walked a batter to start the fourth, bringing junior


