

Baseball: Panthers take two from Rabun, finish third in 8-AA

Hughes and Loyd propel Union past Towns County in five innings

A 13-2 victory over Towns County and consecutive wins over Rabun County allowed Union County (12-15, 5-7) to run its winning streak to seven games while securing the No. 3 seed in Region 8-AA during next week's Class AA State Tournament.

The week got underway with a revenge victory over the neighboring Towns County Indians on Monday. Junior southpaw Lake Hughes allowed just 2 hits over 4 innings, and senior Hunter Loyd lined a first-inning grand slam over the left-field fence to ignite the 13-run outburst.

Junior Thomas Dyer pitched out of a first-and-third in the fifth, allowing Union County to bring the mercy rule into effect with 6 runs in the bottom half of the inning.


State playoff positioning was at stake on Tuesday when the fourth-place Panthers traveled to Tiger for the first of three meetings with Rabun County. Trailing the third-place Wildcats by a game entering the series opener, Union County took game one 5-1 behind a dozen strikeouts from senior ace Zeke Swartz, who also turned in a 3-for-4 performance at the dish.

Back in Blairsville for Friday's doubleheader, Hughes kept Rabun County hitters off balance for 6 2/3 innings, limiting the damage to a Brody Jarrard 2-run homer as Union County prevailed 6-2.

The Wildcats eventually cracked the win column with a 16-8 victory in the finale despite blowing an 8-0 third-inning lead. After the Panthers stormed back to tie it with 8 unanswered runs, Rabun County closed the contest with 8-straight runs, ending a five-game losing skid to Union County.

Panthers 5, Rabun County 1 - Zeke Swartz perfectly executed his skipper's game plan on Tuesday night in Tiger with an overpowering

performance on the mound. "We hope that our pitching will set the tone early, then Zach Odom told the North Georgia News earlier this month when asked how his Panthers would quiet a potent Rabun lineup and breakthrough against an experienced staff. Swartz's first seven outs came via strikeout, en route to his second straight 12-K perfor-

Meanwhile, Coach Odom wasn't forced to wait for a timely RBI as Union County jumped out front 2-0 after one before adding a run in the second and third innings for a 4-0 advantage.

A leadoff double by Hughes allowed Swartz to spot the Panthers an early lead with his first of two doubles on the night. After Loyd reached on an error, senior Damien Chitwood brought Swartz in to score with a base hit to center.

Junior Caleb Towe opened the second with Union's third double of the game. Towe moved up 90 feet on a passed ball, allowing Dyer to make it a 3-0 game on an infield single. Back-to-back doubles by Swartz and Loyd to start the third inning pushed the margin to 4-0.

Following a 1-2-3 bottom half of the frame, Union County stranded two on the heels of consecutive two-out hits from Hughes and Dyer.

Mullanack sparked an insurance run in the seventh with a leadoff single and a stolen base. And after the next two batters failed to put the ball in play, Chitwood delivered his second two-out RBI of the night to build a 5-0 advantage.

The heart of the Wildcats' batting order made the final three outs a challenge, beginning with consecutive doubles from Brady Wilson and Jarrard to pull within four runs. Following a strikeout to the ensuing hitter, Mullanack granted a five-pitch walk that moved the tying run into the on-deck circle. But any comeback hopes were immediately thwarted when second baseman Bailey Brown fielded a grounder and flipped to shortstop Conner Shields, who fired to Swartz for a gameending 4-6-3 double play.

Mullanack fanned two and gave up two hits, one walk and one earned in 2 relief innings. He finished 1 for 4 at the plate with a run and a steal.

Chitwood's night concluded with 2 hits in three atbats while driving in two and drawing a walk.

Hughes doubled, scored and knocked in a run during a 2-for-4 game. Dyer finished 2 a stolen base. He also reached

Hughes stranded a twoout single in the Wildcats' half of the fourth, and Union County pushed its lead to 5-2 after Brown and Hughes singled to open the Panthers' fourth. Mullanack scored Brown with a one-out base hit, and Loyd drove home Hughes via a twoout single.

Shields added another run in the fifth when he scored on Hughes' sacrifice fly following a leadoff single. Rabun's aggressiveness backfired for the second-straight game when Fleming threw out a runner trying to take second on a single to right field in the sixth.

Union County had its opportunities to keep pace but stranded three runners over the first two innings. They finally broke through with 4 runs in the fourth - all coming with two outs. Mullanack sparked the rally when he doubled and scored on a Swartz single. Following a Loyd single and a walk to Chitwood's replacement, freshman Brayden Sweat, a 3-0 pitch plunked Shields to plate Swartz.

Union tacked on two more in the fourth after Swartz sat down the Wildcats in order. Hughes was hit by a pitch and Dyer walked to start the frame. A Swartz walk packed the bases with one down and Loyd scored Hughes on a sacrifice fly. Swartz was thrown out trying to steal second but forced a run-down that allowed Dyer to pull Union within two runs.

Still trailing 8-6 in the sixth, Hughes and Mullanack drew bases on balls to bring the go-ahead run to the dish, and Loyd knotted the score at 8-8 with a two-out opposite-field double.

After throwing 72 pitches on Tuesday, followed by seven more in game two and 86 total in game three, Swartz ran out of gas in the seventh inning. Three hits and three walks resulted in an 11-8 Rabun County lead, forcing Odom to give his senior the hook.

Dyer took over on the hill and gave up 4 earned runs, bringing in Towe to stop the bleeding with a ground out to their first victory in Blairsville second.


