

## Softball: Lady Panthers gearing up for fall with a full slate of games

Union County concludes opening week of summer ball with 3-1-1 record

Union County Softball's first week of preseason action is in the books and so far, head coach Stephen Mitchell likes what he sees from his young squad.

"What a difference a year makes," the second-year coach said after his team played five games last week. "We're so far ahead of where we were last year so right now we're trying to work on the little things like base running and situational hitting and defense.'

The Lady Panthers wrapped up the first week of the summer schedule with a 3-1-1 overall record - the varsity finished 2-0 but had its final game rained out on Thursday evening.


On Tuesday, Union County traveled to Lumpkin County, where the junior varsity defeated White County's varsity, 5-3. The Lady Panthers' varsity squad thumped Lumpkin County, 8-2.

Union County welcomed the same teams to Blairsville a day later and the varsity took care of White County 10-6 and the JV tied Lumpkin County, 5-5.

The only loss of the week came on Thursday when the JV fell on a walk-off to the host team at Habersham Central. The varsity's contest was rained out.

"By the time Thursday rolled around I think we were a little tired," Coach Mitchell said. "But we continued to compete, and to me, that's very important.

"Overall, I saw a daily improvement in our offense.
