Morgan Fussell and UCRD host second annual youth volleyball camp

Camp attendance sees fivefold increase on heels of UCMS volleyball announcement

For the second straight year, recent Union County graduate Morgan Fussell teamed up with the Union County Recreation Department to offer a summer youth volleyball camp for rising 4th through 8th graders.

After attracting seven campers during the 2021 camp, this year's event saw attendance reach 35 entrees following news that Union County Middle School is starting a volleyball program. With the sport's local interest surging, Fussell added a second session to accommodate any girls remaining on the camp's waiting list.

"We didn't expect this many girls to sign up for the Tuesday, Thursday, Friday camp that we originally anticipated," said Fussell, who is preparing for her freshman year of college at Penn State-Altoona. "We ended up with about 10 girls on the waitlist, so our 4-6 (p.m.) Friday class is for those girls on the waitlist. We finally had to cut it off because there was just so many [girls showing interest]. But the rec department has been very supportive, especially with starting [the second]

group."

The camp, which began

The Thrion County Sports Center, provided an introduction to the sport while focusing on the basics and laying a solid foundation for future coaches to build on.

"We want to introduce them to every aspect [of volleyball], but the last two weeks we focused on teamwork and getting three touches on the ball," Fussell said. "But mostly, we've been working on fundamentals and they've picked it up really fast. I'm very pleased with how well they've done."

When asked what lessons were learned from last year's camp that she applied this summer, Fussell admitted that the camp made her remember that she was once young charges.

once in the same position," she said. "But they have made it incredibly easy and have been a great group. We've had so much fun."

Fussell went on to praise her fellow coaches, Kaylee Ashcraft, Addison Cross and Saylor Noe, who are all members of Union County's volleyball team. Ashcraft and Noe are both rising seniors; Cross will to fruition. be a junior.

The youngsters weren't the only ones benefitting from the camp, even college players like Fussell acknowledge that simplifying the sport for the newcomers has been valuable to her own volleyball career.

During her time at UCHS, Fussell lobbied Union County Schools for a middle school volleyball program, and this year her dream comes

Panthers volleyball to host three-day youth camp beginning Wednesday, July 20

With the start of the season only three weeks away, new Union County High School volleyball coach Megan Brown has spent the summer getting acquainted with her two-time Area championship squad.


Since the program's inception five years ago, Union County has already established itself as one of the most decorated volleyball squads in northeast Georgia. During its first half-decade, the Panthers have appeared in four state tournaments, reaching the Elite Eight in 2019 before advancing to consecutive final fours in 2020 and 2021, where they fell both times to the eventual State Champion.

Union County's 2022 campaign opens Aug. 9 with a home scrimmage vs. Hiwassee Dam, North Carolina. The regular season begins Saturday, Aug. 13 at Chestatee.

The North Georgia News caught up with Coach Brown last week to discuss the busy summer schedule and UCHS Volleyball's upcoming youth

NGN: What has volleyball been up to lately? Have they been going all summer like the other sports?

MB: Yes, we have. Besides the two weeks [for the Georgia High School Association's mandatory dead period], we've been in the gym and

NGN: How has the turnout been among the returning players and the incoming freshmen?

MB: We have seven returning seniors, all on varsity, and seven freshmen.

NGN: We have the scrimmage on Aug. 9, but have you seen any other opponents this summer?

MB: We went to White County and played several matches with different schools.

We brought almost everyone, freshman through seniors and it was really neat. They all got on the court and gained some experience in a game setting, which was very good for them.



ting ready for our matches. NGN: Overall, what's been your biggest takeaway

from the summer, so far? **MB:** I've been impressed with the leadership shown by the upperclassmen. I'm also impressed by the work ethic of the freshmen coming up and how much improvement they have shown compared to when I first saw them in May. I'm proud of how they've all come together and worked well together. They are great girls with great attitudes and I'm looking forward to a successful season.'
