"This program existed at the sheriff's office for years," said UCSO Chief Deputy John George. "When Sheriff (Mack) Mason came into office, he realized how important it was to continue it.

"What we do here at the sheriff's office with the Give-A-Gift program, we reach between 30 and 50 families. That may involve multiple kids in each family.

"Our whole objective is to help the kids in the community that need a Christmas have a Christmas, in conjunction with the Blairsville Cruisers. They're one of the biggest supporters of the program. They always give us a sizable donation.

"We try to put together gift packages with what the parents tell us the children like. For example, the boys like cars or the girls like dolls. If they want a stuffed animal or a bicycle, we try to accommodate.
"The donations provided by

the community and the Blairsville Cruisers are what makes this program work."

One of the biggest boosts to the program is the commitment by the Blairsville Cruisers, who work year-round to make Christmas happen for the children of Union County. This year, the Cruisers donated a total of \$2,500 to go toward helping the children in the

"We like to help out in the community and give back," said Cruiser President Pete Barley. "But, most importantly, we want to help out the kids. We want the kids to have a Christmas and to be able to experience this wonderful time of year and how great it is, especially as a child.

"We're thankful that we're able to help out with Shop-With-A-Cop and the Give-A-Gift, and even host our own Christmas shopping experience with Shop-With-A-Cruiser. This year we're looking at taking at least 60 kids in the community to go get toys for

Families wishing to be included in the Give-A-Gift program need only visit the Union County Sheriff's Office to fill out an application, qualifying their child to receive something for Christmas from Give-A-Gift, which provides gifts for children up to 12

The application includes a section where parents can include what the children want for Christmas so the gifts can be

decided accordingly. The children must be Union County residents.

Donations for the program come from churches, individuals, businesses and civic organizations. North Georgia Technical College also made a delivery of toy donations to the sheriff's office recently. These donations were collected under the college's Toys for Tots program, ran by the HEROES (Having Equity Resources and Opportunities Equal Success) Club, Phi Beta Lambda, student government organizations and many other faculty and students at the college.

"If people in the community want to donate toys, we want them to be up to the age of 12," said Chief Deputy George. "We don't want used toys or used stuffed animals. We would like new toys. People can also make a cash donation if they'd like.

"We frequently have needy children or victims of crime or families who are devastated that we can help through the year. And if we don't use that money through the year, then it carries over to next Christmas. It does not go to waste. No donation will be turned away."
