#### **Christmas Fire Safety**

The holiday season is in full swing and everyone has their decorations displayed. It is nice to see all the lights, Christmas trees, and various other decorations. All this enhances everyone's holiday spirit, however; they can also be dangerous. Union County Fire Department would like to remind everyone of the increased fire dangers that are associated with this time of year.

Christmas trees, especially live trees, can be a fire risk. Live trees can dry out quickly. These trees must be watered regularly. Everyone has seen a video on how fast a dry, live tree can catch fire and burn. When choosing a location for the tree, do not place it near any heat sources. It should be



at least three feet away. Make sure that the tree is set up and on a stable platform. Trees can fall into a heat source if not stable. Christmas tree lights should always be turned off at night or when you are away. Christmas tree fires are not common but they can be very devastating to a home and the holidays.

Candles are associated with Christmas and the holidays. Increased use of candles, combined with an increase of combustible, seasonal decorations in many homes means more risk of fire. December is the peak time of the year for candle fires. Great care should be used around any open flames. Candles should be placed away from any flammable material. Children should not be allowed to have candles in their bedrooms or be allowed to use them. One third of the candle fires happen in bedrooms.

Electrical fires can be a fire risk during this time of the year. Lights, decorations, and extension cords should be inspected for frays or exposed wires before use. Overloaded electrical outlets and faulty wires are a common cause of holiday fires. Avoid plugging too many lights and decorations into an outlet. Overloaded circuits can overheat and start a fire. For those outdoor decorations, use Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters (GFCI) outlets. Use lights that have a seal of an accredited certification agency.

These are just a few things to keep in mind when decorating for the holiday season. Union County Fire Department would like for everyone to be safe when preparing their home for this holiday

A. NO. Nothing should be placed on public property - only on private property. In the past, we had a situation where several campaign signs were placed at the Mulky Gap and Blue Ridge Highway intersection. When pulling up to the intersection, the signs were partially blocking the sight distance, and we received two reports of near miss accidents. To create a safe intersection, the Road Department had to go out and take the signs down.

#### Q. Where can campaign signs be located?

A. Generally, they should only be located where you have permission from the property owner to place a sign. However, they are already virtually everywhere. We began mowing the road right of way this week and we have tried to notify some of the candidates to come out and take their signs off the road and high-

#### Q. Are political signs found on roadways any different from signs that advertise businesses?

A. No, we treat political signs and advertising signs the same when it comes to placement on a county road right of way. Q. Why can signs not be placed on the highway right of

A. When these signs are placed in the right of way they become an obstacle for the mowers. As you might imagine, it be-



I have been blessed in my life to experience 65 different Christmas celebrations. As I look back through the years, I can remember many special memories from Christmases past. My first recollection of Christmas was in Chicago. My Daddy lost his job in Alabama and we

had moved up North to find work. Our first Christmas there was miserable. I was homesick. I couldn't understand northern talking, and they couldn't understand



me. We were constantly referred to as hillbilly people. But, everything was made more bearable by a new pair of cowboy boots sent to me by my Uncle Bud a few days before Christmas in 1962.

In 1965 I was able to spend Christmas Break with my Grandparents in Alabama. I went squirrel hunting everyday with Papa. At night we would sit around the fire and listen to stories told by my grandparents. Granny told me about the bitter winters when my Daddy was little. She said, "In those days the mail carriers used wagons or horses to carry the mail." One particular day in mid-December had been brutally cold. So, Granny heated up a big rock by the fireplace and wrapped it in a blanket. She then gave the rock to the mail man when he came by their house. This rock was placed under his feet and it kept his feet from freezing on that cold day in 1940. This story continues to stand out in my memory as one of my favorite Christmas stories given to

me by my Granny. In 1973 Santa Claus brought me an Ithaca .410-gauge shotgun. As usual the family traveled to Alabama to spend Christmas with our family. I was in heaven that week. We hunted rabbits and squirrels in the day and coons at night. I spent every waking hour in the fields and woods during that Christmas Break. But I had a feeling gnawing at my gut that told me something was not right with my father because he had been act-

Normally, my Dad was very outgoing and gregarious. Lately, he had been withdrawn. He acted as if something were worrying him. Prior to 1973 my father was known for hitting the bottle hard. He had a lightning-fast temper, and when he thought us kids weren't around, he used profane language. He only went to church a handful of times before 1973. Christmas night of 1973 everything changed. My father accepted the man whose birthday we had just celebrated. My father's lifestyle was changed in an instant. The temper, profanity and drinking were gone. This is the year everything changed in my fam-

#### **Mast Crop**

A word that you may hear from time to time when talking about wildlife in the fall in winter is "mast." What is mast, why is it important, and can we manage it? Let's talk about these things this week.

The phrase mast crop refers to the fruits

and nuts produced by woody plants. Mast can be split into two groups, hard and soft mast. Hard mast includes nuts like hickory, beech, black walnut,



and acorns (sometimes pronounced 'aikerns' if you are from the south like me). These nuts are generally ready for wildlife consumption in the fall and winter. They are very important for wildlife to have enough food through the winter. before forbs begin growing again in the spring. Soft mast refers to fleshy fruits from plants like dogwood, blackberry, persimmon, black cherry, wild grapes, sassafras, or poison ivy (yes, poison ivy is a great plant for birds). Soft mast tends to be ready for eating in the late summer and early

Mast crop is very important because it essentially makes up the food that wildlife have to get through winter. Last winter the mast crop from oak trees was very poor. That means wildlife like deer had to find food elsewhere, and generally they found it from your yard. This year the acorn crop has been much better, so hopefully deer damage won't be as severe. Mast crops will vary from season to season, and that is natural. Putting out corn in your yard to supplement the mast crop is unnatural. The weather has a big impact on the mast crop. A late frost or drought can severely affect the amount of mast that is out there in a given year.

Oak acorns make up a big part of the mast crop. All native oak trees can be broken into a white or red subgroup. Species in the white oak will produce acorns every year. Even so, some years will have a bumper crop in what is called a 'mast year." Red oaks produce acorns every other year. Wildlife tend to prefer white oak acorns over red oak, as red oak acorns are more bitter. White oaks tend to drop their acorns a little bit earlier than red oaks. Generally, wildlife will eat

all the white oak acorns before eating the red. Is there anything that you can do to support the mast crop? There are a couple of options. The first is to plant more plants that are mast producers. Some mast producing plants are quite attractive, and you may already have them in your landscape. Plants like spicebush, flowering dogwood, or viburnum. The second option is if you have some woods on your property to do some selective thinning. Choosing to leave trees

If a sign has blown down in tall grass or weeds, it might be missed. If the mower hits one of these signs with a metal frame, it can cause major damage to the equipment and can be dangerous to the employees and bystanders as well. The resultant litter is also

Q. If my sign is removed from a county road right of way, what happens to it?

When the Union County Road Department takes up signs to enable them to mow or maintain a right of way, they will collect the signs at the Road Department facility. The Road Department is located on Industrial Blvd (Glenn Gooch Bypass), adjacent to the Health Department. Anyone missing a sign that may have been removed from a right of way can drop by the Road Department to see if it was removed for road maintenance reasons.
