

## Hughes heats up in second half, Panthers prevail at Murphy

Henry's 17, Combs' career-high 15 paces Union in win at White County

Union County (9-2) enters this week's Battle of the States Christmas Tourney riding a four-game winning streak following road victories at White County and Murphy, NC.

Panthers 59, Murphy, NC 50 - Union County avenged its only home loss of the season behind junior Hayden Hughes' 16 second-half points and four 3-pointers on Thursday, Dec. 21

Juniors Houston Henry and Kaden Combs added 13 and 12 points, respectively, as the Panthers pulled away in the fourth quarter, putting Murphy away via a late 7-0 run.

Up 36-33 entering the final frame by way of 5-straight Henry points to close the third, Union County never trailed in the fourth quarter, eventually putting the Bulldogs away in the final moments.

Murphy's Dominick Rummler, who battled foul trouble most of the night, scored on a putback, moving his team within a point to start the fourth. But Henry went on the attack, finding Combs underneath for 2 points and Hughes forced a turnover by diving on a loose ball at midcourt and calling timeout.

Henry hit Combs again on an inbounds pass, bumping the Panthers' lead to 40-35 with 6:45 remaining. Later in the quarter, with Union nursing a 40-38 edge, Hughes drilled a pair of 3s to mount a 46-40 advantage near the 5:00 mark.

Zach Skogen and Rummler inched Murphy within a point at 46-45 with 3:30 to play until Henry hit Combs again for another layup. Then, a Cade Dockrey steal ignited a Union fast break that ended with a Hughes layup.

Rummer trimmed Murphy's margin to 50-47 with 2:07 to play until Henry's kick-out to Hughes for 3 points sparked the 7-0 spurt.

A steal by Henry on the ensuing Bulldogs possession ended with a 2-on-1 break and a Combs layup. Union capped the 7-0 run when Henry converted Ellis' full-court pass into a layup

and a 57-47 lead with 1:04 left. A back-and-forth first half tipped off with Union County grabbing a 10-9 edge after one quarter, courtesy of 6 points from freshman Jaxon Totherow. Later, with Union trailing 18-16

during another low-scoring period, Henry's 3 sent the Panthers into halftime with a 19-18 lead. Union County pushed its

lead to 23-18 during the third, but Murphy stormed ahead 31-28 when Hughes tied things up with his first 3 of the night.

Following a Murphy basket, Henry's trey put Union back in front 34-33 before the junior point guard added two free throws with under a second left in the period.

Henry ended his night with a career-high 6 steals and 5 assists; Combs had 4 rebounds and 2 steals; Hughes added 5 rebounds and 2 steals.

Totherow finished with 8 points and 3 rebounds; Jude Ellis had 6 points and a steal; Dockrey added 4 points, 3 rebounds, 3 assists and 3 steals. Brayden Hogsed chipped

in one assist.

Skogen led Murphy with 15 points and 16 rebounds. Rummler had 11 points and 8 boards.

**Team stats:** Union County shot 37% (23-62) from the floor, 78% (7-9) at the line and 25% (6-24) from long distance.

Murphy hit 30% (16-53) overall, 73% (11-15) at the line and 25% (7-28) from 3-point range.

Murphy owned the glass by a 44-27 margin but Union outscored the Bulldogs 32-14 in the paint. Union forced Murphy into 20 turnovers while the Panthers committed nine.

Panthers 70, White County 64 - Union County seized control with a 17-0 thirdquarter run at White County before holding off a late Warriors' surge and escaping with a 70-64 victory on Tuesday, Dec. 19.

Junior Houston Henry led the way with 17 points, 8 rebounds and 7 assists, while Kaden Combs scored 11 of his career-high 15 points during the first half.

The Panthers built leads of 19-11 and 30-21 and took a

37-34 edge into the break, but White County quickly grabbed a 40-39 advantage early in the second half. But that's when Union rattled off 17 straight points to mount a 56-40 lead during the final minute of the third.

Henry sparked the 17-0 outburst with a dribble-drive just shy of the period's halfway mark, and then sophomore Cade Dockrey hit a pair of free throws for a 43-40 advantage.

A Combs steal turned into a Jude Ellis 3 in transition, followed by a Dockrey steal that led to a Henry layup. Junior Brayden Hogsed came up with another Warriors turnover, and the ensuing fast break ended with a Dockrey layup and free throw.

Coming out of a timeout, White County coughed it up again and Henry knocked down two free throws. Ellis capped the run with a corner-3, spotting Union County a 56-40 lead with 1:05 left in the third.

Out front 56-42 entering the fourth, Union County surrendered a 10-0 run, slicing the difference to 56-52 near the 5:30 mark. Henry stopped the bleeding with a triple, and Hogsed's backdoor feed to Ellis kept the margin at seven a minute later.

Two Henry free throws on Union's next possession bumped the margin to 63-54 until consecutive buckets by White County had the home team within five.

However, Combs delivered down the stretch, tipping in Dockrey's miss with 2:50 remaining. But with the Panthers clinging to a 65-59 lead with under a minute remaining, a costly turnover led to a White County and-1, cutting the difference in half with 49 seconds left.

That's when Combs provided the game's pivotal sequence, beginning with a fast-break putback of Hayden Hughes' miss, and then pulling down a defensive board on the other end with 20 seconds to play.

Ellis and Hughes put the game on ice at the free throw line for a Panthers squad that finished a season-best 85% (11 for 13) at the charity stripe.


Combs added 5 rebounds and 3 steals to his 15-point night; Dockrey went for 14 points, 6 rebounds and 4 assists. Ellis finished with 10 points and 3 assists; freshman Jaxon Totherow scored 8 points; Hogsed had 3 points and 3 assists; Hughes chipped in 3 points and 7 boards.

**Team stats:** Union County shot 42% (26-62) overall and 35% (7-20) from long distance. White County hit 40% (24-60) from the floor, 19% (4-21) from deep and 80% (12-15) at the line. After the 3-point shot kept them in the game early, the Warriors cooled off considerably after halftime, going 0-for-8 from downtown over the final 16 minutes.

White County held a 37-35 edge on the boards but was outscored 38-26 in the paint. Union County committed 11 turnovers to the Warriors' 14.

Senior Noah Futch paced White County with 14 points. 11 rebounds and 4 assists; John Phillips had 12 points and 9 boards.

## Lady Panthers sink Murphy, NC with 22-1 first-half run

No. 6 White County hits 12 treys in 79-41 win over Union County

Playing without the services of its second-leading scorer Paula Robertson, Union County split two road games last week at White County and Murphy, NC.

The Lady Panthers (5-6) enter the this week's Battle of the States Christmas Tournament looking to climb over .500 for the first time this season.

Lady Panthers 68, Murphy, NC 39 - Union County broke open a 12-12 tie courtesy of a 22-1 secondquarter run, building a 34-13 margin and a 34-16 halftime lead.

Junior Ariel McCarter scored 15 of her game-high 19 points in the first half as the Lady Panthers were never threatened after the break. Junior Sloane Dyer connected three times from 3-point range, en route to a career-high 11 points; senior Lara Turner added 10 points in the win.

Union County jumped out to a 12-6 lead until Murphy rattled off six straight to knot the score early in the second. But it was all Lady Panthers the rest of the way, scoring the next 17 points to trigger the 22-1 onslaught, putting the Bulldogs away.

McCarter and Dyer combined for four 3s and 14 points during Union County's 22-point second period. Turner scored four in the quarter, Mull had two, Adams and Brown added one apiece.

Senior Kamryn Mull knocked down a pair of 3s in the second half to finish with


