to avoid having two separate primaries and runoffs which would have created a huge cost for counties and would have been very confusing for Georgia voters. By moving the primary date earlier it also moves the qualifying period earlier for all offices. Qualifying will be March 3 – March 7 this year followed by the May 20 election.

Q.How many questions have you answered in your column this past year?

A. We answered 378 questions in 2013. I started this Q & A format soon after I first took office in 2001 as a

way of keeping the public informed about the inner workings of county government. A majority of the questions are actual questions asked by the public, but many are informative questions about a particular subject. My assistant has kept an index of every question asked over the years and it is amazing to go back and see the various subjects covered, everything from A (Animal Control) to Z (zoning). If you average around 400 questions a year that would be 5,200 questions over the 13 years I have been in office.

This takes a lot of time and effort, but I feel it is one of the best ways that I have of communicating with the public.

Peanut butter is used in a more savory way in other cultures. Chicken, sweet potatoes and peanut butter are one of those magical flavor combinations, the ingredients to a favorite African stew. A visit to Singapore will have you enjoying a national comfort food called laksa, often made

of butternut squash cubes and peanut butter. The Vietnamese make a delectable turkey and cilantro meatball and serve it with a dip made of Peanut butter and hot sauce.

When you compare Peanut Butter's costs per protein value, it rates pretty high. Per pound, the protein value of PB is \$9.60. Milk is \$11.57, tilapia and hamburger meat are \$13.60 a pound and tofu is \$15.15 a protein pound.
