ESPLOST ballot ready for voters to decide

The Union County School system has collected \$42 million since the state allowed communities to use a penny sales tax for school improvements.

So, what has the school system used those funds for?

They've built a new high school made up of 153,000 square feet, including a new gymnasium. The facility includes a new vocational facility, greenhouse, a sports complex, stadium renovations, and grading for future facilities.

They've also built a new middle school, made up of 100,754 square feet of space that includes a gymnasium, band room, weight room and computer laboratories.

They renovated the elementary school, put a new

roof on it, new heating and air equipment, new exterior doors and hardware. All this work included painting the facility and construction of computer laboratories.

New offices were constructed at The Primary School and computer laboratories were constructed.

At Woody Gap School, a 19,825 square-foot gymna-

sium was built. The Rock Building was renovated, and a new kitchen/cafeteria/media center was added.

Communications woes under investigation

Union and Towns counties were trapped in the dark ages for almost two hours last week as a major communications failure left both counties without cable, phone service, Internet and cell phone service.

The massive communications outage occurred at approximately 6:30 p.m. on Monday.

All land telephone lines of Windstream, cell phone coverage by Verizon and AT&T and Union County's E-911 system went dark on Monday evening, Sole Commissioner Lamar Paris said.

"It was in Towns and Union that we know of so far," Paris said. "There will

be a serious investigation of what happened and why.

"This is naturally of major concern to all counties involved," Paris said. "Fortunately, during the outage of more than an hour, we were very fortunate that no emer-

Lawmakers hear the TAVT pleas

If you purchased a vehicle in another state over the last 14 months when you go to the Tax Commissioner's Office at the Union County Courthouse.

Georgia lawmakers amended the Title Ad Valorem Tax to allow sales tax paid to

Georgia through out-of-state purchases to count toward the title tax that took root March 1.

Union County Tax Commissioner Lee Knight said that the state law has been amended and a vehicle purchased outside of Georgia may be eligible to opt-in if all the other opt-in requirements are met.

Before March 6, if you

had purchased a vehicle in another state, even though the 7 percent sales tax was paid to the state, vehicle owners still had to pay the 6.5 percent title tax in Georgia.

State lawmakers realized the problem and corrected it last week.

And just last week, Knight encountered his first

Paris: 'Lowe's Mill could reopen next week'

Lowe's Mill Road soon will be back in working order, Union County Sole Commissioner Lamar Paris said last week.

The roadway was heavily damaged during one of the Jan. 30th flood events.

Commissioner Paris expects the road to reopen soon, possibly next week, he said.

"We hope to have it open some time next week, all except the paving," Paris said. "Once the weather cooperates, we will then come back and work on the paving. That will require the road be closed for an additional day or two.

"Once this project is completed, we should not have any future problems un-

less we ever have a catastrophic flood event," Paris said.

The Georgia Department of Transportation is assisting the county with the project's completion, Paris

said.

The project includes replacing culverts to improve the flow of storm water and

Wanted suspect nabbed in Cherokee

Union County Sheriff Mack Mason says his department has solved a theft of property case.

Also, the sheriff says a search of Union County Schools resulted in four juveniles being disciplined for marijuana possession.

First, Union County sheriff's Detective Darren Osborn has arrested Michael Millwood, 20 of Bartow County related to the theft of metal forms belonging to a local construction company, Sheriff Mason said.

Millwood was arrested in Cherokee County, in Canton, following a routine traffic stop, the sheriff said.

The stolen forms were cut up with a power torch and sold for scrap metal in Bartow County, Sheriff Mason said.

"Mr. Millwood broke

down and rolled on his accomplice," Sheriff Mason said. "We've got warrants for that individual, and he's down in South Georgia."

According to Detective Osborn, the Union County Sheriff's Office secured videotape of Millwood driving his vehicle over scales at a scrap yard in Bartow County with the cut up forms in the back of

the vehicle.

The Bartow County Sheriff's Office assisted in the investigation, Detective Osborn said.

Millwood, who has been on the lam since February, and was listed as one of Union County's Most Wanted, was arrested for his Union County charges after he was taken into custody in Cherokee County, Detective Osborn said.

"Cherokee County got him on a traffic stop," Osborn said. "Mr. Millwood confessed to everything, and he turned evidence on his accomplice, David Hartley.

"We now have outstanding warrants on Mr. Hartley," Osborn said.

Sheriff Mason was disgusted by the crime.

"I don't know what this world is coming to when you steal the tools of a man's trade," Sheriff Mason said.

From the moment they stepped out on stage, they owned it.


They put on a show Las Vegas style with their classic rock hits *You Really Got Me*, *Born to Be Wild*, *Superstition*, and *Foxy Lady*.

Burglary suspect nabbed in Murphy, NC

Also, Sheriff Mason warns residents to beware of scams

Union County Sheriff Mack Mason says one individual is in custody in Murphy, NC related to a burglary here where \$5,000 worth of guns and coins were stolen.

Tyler Gibbs, 18, of Murphy, NC, also is being held on drug charges in Murphy, after authorities learned he was staying at an extended stay motel in Murphy and discovered a large quantity of methamphetamine, Sheriff Mason said.

Union County Sher-

iff's Detective Darren Osborn was the lead investigator in the case, as authorities here searched for stolen shotguns, a Glock 9mm handgun, and

various stolen gold and silver coins, Sheriff Mason said.

Detective Osborn got a tip that Gibbs was holed up in a motel in Murphy, the sheriff said. Authorities in Cherokee County, NC and the Murphy Police Department were contacted to assist with the case, Detective Osborn said.

"Sure enough, he was at the hotel with another individual," Osborn said. "As part of the investigation, and a search of the motel room the two were staying in, a large quantity of methamphetamine was discovered in the motel room." Gibbs currently is being held
