Currently, a nonprofit called Ten Commandments Georgia is creating the displays, which are built to the letter of the law.

The nine documents included in the display are: the Ten Commandments, the Mayflower Compact of 1620, the Declaration of Independence, the Magna Carta, "The Star-Spangled Banner" by Francis Scott Key, the National Motto: "In God We Trust," the Preamble to the Georgia Constitution, the Bill of Rights of the U.S. Constitution, and the description on the image of Lady Justice.

Dr. Fred Lodge, pastor of First Baptist Church of Blairsville, was the driving force behind bringing the display to Union County. After having read about the law last year, he contacted other area pastors, seven of whom decided to pitch in and support the effort with their parishioners.

Those pastors are: Dr. Lodge, George Cline of Antioch Baptist Church, Scotty Jarrard of Harmony Grove Baptist Church, Marty Duncan of Fellowship of the Hills Church, Mark Burgess of First United Methodist Church of Union County, Don Parmely of New Life Family Church, Bill Schakat of Redeemer Baptist Church and R. L. Martin of Zebulon Baptist Church.

"The display, which includes nine significant historical documents, is an excellent way to help educate our communities across the state about the historical facts concerning our nation's founding," said Dr. Lodge, who went on to thank Union County Sole Commissioner Lamar Paris for his blessing in the endeavor.

Union County is only the 34th county of 159 in the state to have posted the display, thanks to the approval of Commissioner Paris.

The ceremony included an introduction of the display by Dr. Lodge, and Commissioner Paris spoke following a brief but heartfelt invocation led by Dr. Lodge.

Commissioner Paris went through each of the documents, telling those gathered of their historical importance to the county and beyond - for example, he said that the Declaration of Independence was perhaps the "most important document in American history," and he called Lady Justice a 'symbol of the fair and equal administration of the law, without corruption, prejudice or favor."
