In the evaluation we talked about the economic impact of the Farmers Market. This economic impact was determined by asking vendors about the amount of money they collected each week at the Farmers Market. We have about 84 vendors at the market each week. These vendors collect about \$19,300 per week. We are open for about 20 weeks. Therefore, our ven-

dors collect about \$386,000 per year at the Farmers Market. Remember, the people coming to our market also go out to eat or maybe they go to the store to purchase gas. They may even stay in town at a hotel or rent a cabin for the weekend. As you can see the Farmers Market has a tremendous impact upon this community.

Hopefully, this year that trend will continue. Next Saturday, an Antique Tractor Show and Swap Meet will be held at the Market from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m. Come on out to see us and bring your tractor or your old antique tractor parts. The annual Ramp and Plants Day will be held on April 30th and the annual Strawberry Day will be held on May 7th. And don't forget about our Trash to Treasures Sale each Friday from 7:30 a.m. until 2 p.m.

During this time, cows should be fed to a BCS of 5 and heifers to a BCS of 6 to ensure optimum pregnancy rates. Finally, checking the body condition at breeding helps to shed light on any reduced pregnancy rates or issues.

If your cows are not in a condition that you would like them to be, it's important to choose the correct supplement to get them to an optimum BCS. There are a wide range of supplements to choose from which can help cows and heifers to gain the weight needed for successful pregnancies.

Because minerals and vitamins play little role in BCS, protein and energy need to be the top considerations in choosing nutritional supplements. Testing forage quality to determine any nutrient deficiencies will help you decide which supplements to feed your herd to keep your animals in the best possible condition.

duty to help you.

Chief Jonas and his crew had that feeling of duty that day. They start up stairwell B, one of the three stairways in the building. They realize that they have to go up maybe 80 flights with full gear consisting of turnout gear and SCBA along with their equipment. They are carrying approximately 60-70 extra pounds.

Chief Jonas devises a plan to go 10 flights at a time and rest. The stairwell is crowded with people going down to get out as the Ladder 6 crew starts up. As they get to the 27th floor, the entire building shakes and rumbles. Chief Jonas stops his crew and goes on that floor to look things over. He finds that the south tower has just collapsed. He realizes it's time to get out.

He returns to his crew and tells them they are getting out. They hesitate. They want to keep going but Chief Jonas knows the building may come down any minute. As they move out, Chief Jonas describes finding Josephine Harris sitting on the stairs. She is crying and says she can't go any further.

The Ladder 6 crew, firefighters who want to help, begin to assist her down the steps. It is painstakingly slow. As they reach the 4th floor, the building rumbles, the power goes out and Chief Jonas describes a tornado like wind starts down the stairwell. They are all thrown to the floor and the entire building shakes.

When it finally stops, they are in the dark, covered with dust and debris. They check on each other and find out that they are all alive. They look for ways to keep going but no way is found. Chief Jo-

nas calls for a MAYDAY. After several attempts and a span of time that Chief Jonas describes as "an eternity", they are answered. Firefighters, even in a big department, know each other. His friends get on the radio and want to know where he is and they keep saying, "I'm coming for you brother".

Chief Jonas tells them their location, "Stairwell B, 4th floor". They keep asking and he keeps telling them. They then ask him to describe how he got into the building. Chief Jonas is confused and wants to know why they keep asking. They tell him that they are having a hard time finding stairwell B in the almost 6 stories of rubble. They all realize that the tower collapsed. Eventually, after 4 hours of searching and digging, they find a way to the surface and they get out with the help of the other firefighters.

One of the things that Chief Jonas explains is how proud he was of his crew. They did their duty. They helped Josephine.

They didn't know who she was; all they knew was that she needed help. He said that he overheard some of this crew calming her down and saying things like, "as long as we are here, nothing will happen to you."

The story is amazing and it was great to hear it from Chief Jonas, the person who lived it.

When it comes to the 9/11 attacks, as American citizens, we think of our country attacked by terrorists and many lives lost. As a firefighter, we think of "343," the number of firefighters who lost their lives that day and "Never forget" because the sacrifices made that day should never be forgotten.
