responsible for increasing plant growth than any other element. Plants use nitrogen to make amino acids which are the building blocks of protein. Nitrogen is also used in forming protoplasm which is the seat of cell division and plant growth. Nitrogen will stimulate plant growth. However, too much nitrogen will stimulate excessive vegetative growth. If you have ever had tomato plants that grew tall, but, would not set fruit it was probably due to excessive nitrogen.

Another element essential for plants is phosphorus. No other nutrient can be sub-

stituted for phosphorus. It plays a key role in photosynthesis, cell division, and energy storage. Phosphorus will promote healthy root development and fruit quality. Excessive phosphorus doesn't hurt plants. However, it can get washed into streams and cause algae blooms in lakes.

Potassium is another vital plant nutrient for plant growth. Plants use potassium in photosynthesis and respiration. Inadequate potassium causes reduced photosynthesis and increased respiration in the plant. Reduced photosynthesis and increased respira-

tion decreases the amount of sugars produced by the plant. Therefore, inadequate potassium results in a lower quality of the fruit or the vegetable being produced. Also, an inadequate supply of potassium will result in decreased winter hardiness of plants.

How can you supply these nutrients to your plants? You can buy dry fertilizer or you can purchase liquid fertilizer. A bag of fertilizer usually has three numbers on it. These numbers represent the percentages of nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium in the bag of fertilizer. For example, a bag

of 5-10-15 has 5 percent nitrogen, 10 percent phosphorus and 15 percent potassium in the bag. Even if you buy the popular liquid foliar feed fertilizers you should pay attention to these numbers. One of the more popular liquid fertilizers has a nitrogen content of 35 percent, a phosphorus content of 15 percent and potassium content of about 15 percent. Be careful when using this formulation because you could stimulate excessive growth in tomatoes resulting in no fruit set. For more information please call me at (706) 439-6030.

A. This type of government is more efficient by being able to make timely decisions, often in a day, in which it could take a commission board months to decide on the same issue. One nearby county's citizen group has been trying for more than two years to get a dog park. They have had committees and meeting after meeting with the commissioners, and they still do not have one. It took us a week to decide we were going to have a dog park.

We are able to spend money on what is really necessary and not on what each commissioner wants spent in his part of the county. We have a better pulse on the community because we are hearing from our

constituents every day and we are responding to their problems every day. By being full time employees, we know everything about the county operations, employees and finances, while in most counties that job is left to an unelected manager with part time commissioners who often try to govern based on word of mouth from others.

**Q. Do you remember when former Senator Chip Pearson talked about sole commissioners?**

A. I sure do. There was a small group from here that asked him to put legislation in to change our form of government several years ago. Senator Pearson, who was from Dawson County, and often

said he still missed the days when Dawson County had a sole commissioner, told the group that he would not introduce legislation unless he felt like the majority of citizens in the community wanted it, not just a few. He never introduced it because he never heard from more than a few wanting it.

**Q. How do you think most legislators feel about the sole commissioner form of government?**

A. I certainly cannot answer that question for you, but I will suggest to you that if you talk to the legislators who have sole commissioners in their district, I'll bet they will tell you that they like dealing with them because they can get good decisions quickly. To be continued next week




