The Union County High School Band and the Appalachian St. Andrews Pipes and Drums provided music for both the parade and the ceremony, and CW4 Jerry Cannon, U.S. Army (Ret.), who is also a member of Appalachian St. Andrews, delivered the keynote address.

Waymon did basic training at Ft. Hood, TX and received the Machine Gun Expert Badge & Rifle Marksman Badge. He also received the National Defense Service Metal, Vietnam Service Metal, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Ribbon w/ Device, and eventually the Purple Heart.

While in the 198th Infantry Brigade as a Recon Scout he achieved the rank of Sergeant (E5). After being sent to Vietnam he was severely wounded and spent many months in hospitals overseas where he received lifesaving surgeries. He then spent 11 months in the hospital at Ft. Benning, GA where he underwent several more
