

Emma Garrison to run track, cross country at UGA

After compiling one of the most successful resumes in the history of Union County High School athletics, cross county and track-and-field star Emma Garrison will depart Region 8-AA to set the pace in the Southeastern Conference over the next four years.

While the rest of the state was elated to see Garrison, the two-time State Champion graduate last month, the state's university was able to nab the Blairsville native and keep her home, where she will be christened as a Bulldog in the fall.

Garrison will be running both track and cross country at UGA and there is no doubt that her competitive drive and work ethic caught the eye of the Bulldog coaching staff.

Instead of taking it easy following graduation, Garrison will train six days a week over the summer before school begins in August.

The Georgia women's track team is made up of a majority of freshman and sophomore distance and mid-distance runners, but did graduate a pair of seniors and featured four juniors this past season. However, the women were unable to qualify any runners for the NCAA Championships.

Currently on the UGA roster is a pair of runners that Garrison has faced before in Lovett's Hailey Branch (risingjunior, who also runs cross coun-

While running cross country at UCHS, Garrison won two Junior Lauren Kelley was individual State championships in

Region 8-AA titles (2012, 2013, 2015), and two Region 8-AA team championships (2014 and 2015).

She claimed one individual Region 8-AA second place finish while battling injuries (2014) and her team finished second in Region 8-AA twice (2012, 2013).

In 2014 Union County rejuvenated its track and field program with Garrison winning the Region 8-AA Championship in the 1600M race and placing second in the 800M race.

Garrison would then lead

the upstart track and field program to State during its first season in more than 20 years where she went on to claim fifth in the 1600M and third in the 800M.

In 2015 Garrison was the Region 8-AA Champion in the of a record holding 4x400 relay 1600M and 800M races and placed sixth in the 800M and seventh in the 1600M at State.

Last month, Garrison was second in State in the 800M race and fourth in the 1600M race after owning 8-AA in both events at the Region meet, back in April.

as a 10-time Region Champ and back-to-back State Champion, she also leaves UCHS as the school record holder in the 3200M, the 1600M, 800M, 300M Intermediate Hurdles, and was a member team, not to mention numerous cross country records.
