historical for Blairsville itself, but we have a couple of Confederate Soldiers that fought up here for the South," said Holman. "It's a big part of our town's history, and it would be better if it was cleaned up and it was known how many graves are here."

The cemetery contains gravesites dating back to the early 1800s, and ground-penetrating radar has brought to light 105 unmarked graves. Prior to Saturday, many of the headstones were black with dirt and mildew, a few toppled either from age or other rea-

And Holman, in a showing of local pride and respect for those who came before him, decided that the place needed a little TLC to counteract the long years of neglect.

"That's what I'm here trying to do, trying to get it out there, try to get people to want to donate money so we can get a fence and maybe some better markers to put where the unmarked graves are," said Holman, looking ahead past his project to the future of the historic Blairsville site.

The City of Blairsville recently acquired the Old Blairsville Cemetery through a quitclaim process, as the owner of the land, like many of the graves on the property, was unknown.

"It is a beautiful day, and this is such a cool project because there's such history in here. And we're hoping we'll find even some more history, and maybe we can end up finding out what that was," said Commissioner Paris, pointing

to a large pile of rocks placed conspicuously in the shape of

Some have wondered if the old cemetery is home to ancient Native American burials, though solving the mysteries of the rock pile and the unmarked graves is unlikely given today's technology, which would require disturbing the sites.

Bob Scoda, retired from Florida since 1997, conducts cemetery surveys as a hobby, and has been instrumental in cataloguing many cemeteries in Union County.

"This is probably the oldest cemetery that's in Union County," said Scoda. "They're all in the 1800s, most of them. Some of them are newer, but this cemetery started a long time ago."

The Boy Scouts worked hard to scrub the grime from headstones, many of them puzzling as they went to determine the names of the people atop whom they were cleaning.

"They're using a substance called D/2, which is a biological cleaner, which is basically taking the mold and mildew and lichens off, and getting these monuments to where you can read them a little bit better," said Vince

Evans managed Alta Vista Cemetery in Gainesville for 14 years, and was also vice president of the Georgia Municipal Cemetery Association.

"Normally, you just don't go in willy-nilly and clean monuments," said Evans. "There needs to be a reason to clean them, like you can't read

them or they've got lichen on them or have mildew."

The cleanup was a huge community affair, starting as an Eagle Scout project and ending as a way for people to care for the memories of the dead. Many graves were cleaned, some were pieced back together, and the Old Blairsville Cemetery was brought back into the fold as an important

piece of Georgia history.

"This is a good community project," said Evans. "Cemeteries just bring people together."

Residents with knowledge of relatives buried in the Old Blairsville Cemetery are encouraged to notify the city and county in an effort to further the historical record of the
