who attend the cookout Open House, the function serves as much more than just a way to raise money for the much needed equipment used to fight fires and save lives.

"It's a fundraiser, but it's also a chance for everybody to come and have a look at the equipment, look at the station, see if there's anything new," said Union County Fire Chief David Dyer, who brought his kids that day. "People drive by this fire station - they know it's a fire station, they see the building up here, but they don't know what's in it and what goes on here."

"So when they come to these open houses, they can kind of check it out, see who's here, see what the firemen do, all that good stuff."

The Saturday event harkened back to the days of yesteryear, when community members would meet at a central location and just enjoy each other's company, and Station 3 firefighters made sure to keep the burgers cooking, the drinks cold and the guests entertained.

Fun wasn't necessarily a requirement for the day, but it was in full supply and nowhere near running out - firefighters and community members mixed seamlessly for a successful community event and firefighter fundraiser.

Children played in an inflatable bounce house and took pictures with a towering 20-foot-tall Smokey the Bear provided by the Georgia Forestry Commission, and all of the trucks and rescue vehicles at Station No. 3 were pulled out and put on display for the public.

"There was something just like this when I was a kid. We went to an Open House, and they did a bunch of stuff for the kids - they got in the

fire trucks - and I just kind of wanted to be one ever since then."

Added Station 3 Firefighter Warren Cole: "It's definitely a brotherhood, like he said. We're all family here. You've got to be, because you're going into a house that's on fire, and you've got to be able to trust the guy next to you."

Louise Wilson lives just a half mile from Station No. 3, and she visited the Open House with her friends. She said that day she had full confidence that if her house caught fire, it would be quickly put out by the men of Station 3.

"I think it's a wonderful thing for them to be doing," said Wilson, speaking about the Union County volunteer firefighters. Wilson is a strong supporter of the Union Coun-

ty Fire Department, having attended the Station No. 10 Halloween Dance as Catwoman last October.

Union County Sole Commissioner Lamar Paris and Dinah, his wife, also attended the Open House on Saturday, along with County Manager Larry Garrett and County Clerk Jennifer Queen, both from the commissioner's office.

"This is one of the largest crowds I've ever seen here," said Commissioner Paris. "It's really nice to see the community supporting the fire station, and the fire station supporting the community. These guys do an awesome job, as all of our volunteer stations do, and I appreciate so much all the work they do."

"I'm not sure the public always understands the amount of time and effort these guys and gals put in through training, all to be here and available for protecting our public. So we really appreciate what they do."
