
Fifty-eight

three hundred seven. That is the number – a

big, meaningful number – of names inscribed on The Wall in the District of Columbia as of Memorial Day 2015.

These 58,307 names reflect military personnel wounded and who ultimately died as a result of the Vietnam

This Friday, Union County will honor the fallen along with the many Vietnam veterans who returned from the frontlines, men and women who still fight the war in their hearts to this day.



"I hereby proclaim June

the 26th, 2015, as a day of Commemoration for the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War," said Union County Sole Commissioner Lamar Paris. "We as a community reflect

with solemn reverence upon the valor of a generation that served with honor. We pay tribute to the more than 3 million servicemen and women who left their families to serve bravely."

Commissioner signed the proclamation on Tuesday, June 16, in the monthly commission meet-



Early results of the investigation determine that Cone died of a fatal gunshot wound. Detectives are still interviewing witnesses while awaiting autopsy results from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's crime laboratory.

Sgt. Hammond elaborated that the gunshot was not self-inflicted.


Sgt. Hammond said the Sheriff's Office has identified the shooter, but await the complete results of the investigation before making the "We want to talk with

The Union County Board of Education unanimously approved its Fiscal Year 2015 Budget Amendments and the Fiscal Year 2016 Budget at its regular monthly meeting.

Last year, the BOE budgeted for \$25.885 million for the School System's General Fund. For the 2016 Fiscal Year Budget, that figure is \$27.484 The BOE budget for

2016 is the same as 2015 in terms of expenses. The board must now wait for the completion of the Tax Digest by the Union County Tax Commissioner's Office.

The results of the tax digest will determine if the School Millage Rate goes up or down.
