Registered voters can head to the Union County Courthouse on July 9 and begin the early voting process.

Voters only have two local issues to cast ballots on.

In the nonpartisan Probate Judge race, Incumbent Dwain Brackett goes head-tohead with political newcomer Barry Weinstein.

Also on the ballot for locals, whether to approve a 1 cent sales tax for regional transportation projects. The 1 cent increase

would make 8 cents collected on each dollar before you head out of the grocery, retail or any other store in Union County.

It also would be a tax on home heating fuel, the first \$5,000 on a vehicle purchase and on over the counter medications at any store or pharmacy.
