Union's 10&U softball finishes third at State

The Union County Recreation Department's youth baseball and softball teams just wrapped up District tournament play over the weekend with the 10&U baseball squad earning a trip to the State Tournament in unusual fashion, while the 12&U baseball Panthers lit up the scoreboard - posting a football score against some of the toughest competition in the northeast Georgia area.

The following paragraphs regarding the 12&U baseball team were submitted by Danny Hemphill, coach of the 12&Uteam that won a District 6 championship this past Sunday in Dawsonville.

The Union County 12&U Dizzy Dean All-Star team traveled to Dawsonville to compete in the District 6 baseball tournament last week.

The Panthers came away with the championship trophy by winning six-out-of-seven games in the double-elimination tournament. Two of their victories came against the Jefferson Dragons, whom the Panthers defeated in the 2013 10&U tournament championship game.

The Panthers defeated Jackson County in the final two games on Wednesday after losing to them in the finals of the winner's bracket contest on Tuesday. After several tight games that were decided in the last innings, the Panthers proceeded to score 17 runs in the first inning of the championship game and cruised to a 21-6 victory.
