Brackett returns to office; T-SPLOST canned, runoff in 9th

Union County Probate Judge Dwain Brackett is back; T-SPLOST is dead; and Doug Collins and Martha Zoller are neck and neck at press time in the 9th District Congressional

Judge Brackett cruised to victory Tuesday night with a solid performance in Tuesday's primary over challenger Barry Weinstein.

Judge Brackett finished with 3,478 votes or 71.87 percent, to Weinstein's 1,344 votes, or 28.13 percent.

Judge Brackett said he couldn't be more happy. "It was a good night

and the good people of Union



Judge Dwain Brackett County have spoken," Brackett said. "It's a heart-warming experience and a very humbling experience.'

Judge Brackett had a reception for his supporters at Grinds and Glazes.

The room was packed and each time election results were read, the crowd lit up the room with a hearty cheer. "I was humbled and

overwhelmed by the show of support that I have received in this election," Judge Brackett said. "When you're in the midst of a campaign, you can never really be prepared for what the results may or may not be. Tonight, I was reminded of the supporters I have and the support I have for the way we run my office and I just want to thank the voters for returning me to office.

"I am committed to them, I will continue to provide them with professional service from their Probate Court," Judge Brackett said.

The turnout for the primary was almost 38 percent with locals casting 5,046 ballots.

One of the hottest issues on the ballot in recent years drew a loud and resounding 'no' from Union County voters and voters in all 13 counties within the Georgia Mountains Region.

The transportation 1-cent sales tax was soundly defeated region-wide, with voters within the region turning the referendum back with
