The area has recently been mowed in order to better identify the lay of the land as the planning process begins, Hartman said.

"Going forward there will likely be questions such as, what will happen to the buildings on the square?," Hartman said. "The Development Authority will have the buildings evaluated and base future decisions on those findings."

Hartman believes the DDA's purchase of the property is a very positive step in the downtown vision for the revitalization of the City by shaping an inviting and thriving center in Union County.

"In addition to the Downtown Streetscape, which should begin later this year, the overall investment will be significant to the downtown district as we work to bring new life to the heart of our mountain community," she said.
