Appalachian Sweetness Day. It's that time of year where the richness of the fruits and earthy squashes are enhanced by spices and sugar. Pears, apples, pumpkins and winter squash all taste better with cardomon, cinnamon, sorghum and honey.

Here's a recipe that is fit for a "gang" visiting your place to indulge their Florida sensitivities with our colorful autumn flora. I concocted this recipe for a camp of 10 "stitchers" over a dozen years ago, and it has proven to be one of the most requested dishes whenever we gather.

Place the last 8 slices on top of this. Pour the balance of the egg over the top. Sprinkle balance of brown sugar. Cover w/ tin foil. Let sit overnight in the fridge. Bake, covered, in 350 degree oven for 30 mins. Remove foil and bake 10 mins. uncovered. Serve with this heated syrup combo: 2 tablespoons of melted butter, ½ cup of maple syrup and ½ cup of sorghum syrup.

are 15 or 20 more who would like to participate, but, there is simply no place to house them.

Presently, the Farmers Market has 56 spaces available. And there are a number of vendors who must be located.

Market has 56 spaces available. And there are a number of vendors who must be located outside the building and under tents. Of those approximately 60 vendors, approximately 45 are agricultural-related.

Meaning these vendors

Meaning these vendors sell products that are agriculturally related, produce, grits, plants, canned goods, etc.

The Union County Farmers Market brings \$750,000 per year in to the vendors of the market.

The vendors then spend

the money they generate in and around Union County.

Also, the market attracts

150,000 to 200,000 visitors per year to Union County.

The Canning Plant has processed more than 12,000 jars of food this year at a value

of more than \$45,000.

That saves Union County families a lot of money in the grocery store. Also, more than 200 different people have used

the Canning Plant this year.

The plant will remain open until Oct. 17th. Then the plant will open for special days on Oct. 29th, Nov. 12th, and Dec. 10th. We open at 6 a.m. and close at noon.
