marriage.
When she was younger, Amelia prayed and prayed for a little brother or sister, though she never guessed she'd get three in one go – and neither did Jennifer and John-Mark.

"I had pretty much given up hope," said Jennifer, adding that the couple tried for many years for a pregnancy before giving in vitro fertilization a shot. "I had three eggs left and I'd already given up. John-Mark was like, well, let's not just leave those three eggs out there – let's give it a go.

Jennifer and John-Mark were financially and emotionally spent after several unsuccessful fertility treatments, but they decided to try one last time for a baby. Their embryologist gave one of the three remaining eggs a zero percent chance of growing, and the other two about a 20 percent or less chance.

To their surprise, the result was nothing short of miraculous, as all three eggs took hold and were developing into the babies the couple had prayed and hoped for during their years of trying for one.

At about the 28th week of pregnancy Jennifer developed preeclampsia, which meant that her three babies had to be delivered by cesarean section at 33 weeks instead of the full-

Less than a week after being born, two of the girls, Carlyn and Ava, were diagnosed with necrotizing enterocolitis, or NEC, and had to undergo emergency surgery at Egleston.

NEC is a fairly common disease that effects infants, primarily those born prematurely, and occurs when tissue of the large or small intestines becomes injured or begins to die.

Of the two girls, Carlyn's situation was worse, but the doctors were able to save both of their lives that night.

Because of the severity of her condition following birth, Carlyn has experienced health issues over the years. She gets dehydrated easily and is greater effected by illnesses from which other children might just bounce right back.

This is how she found herself admitted to Egleston for the third time this year,



which was the trip that landed her on the website of *People* Magazine, the TODAY Show, in the Atlanta Journal-Constitution, and now her local

Everyone wanted to know – what did you and Chris Pratt talk about?

"There were doctors lined up to meet him, there were nurses lined up to meet him, there were all kinds of kids," said Jennifer. "Egleston's like our home away from home, we're there all the time, and I have never seen this place so packed before. He was only going to be there for an hour, from 10 a.m. until 11 a.m., and I'm thinking that there is no way we're going to be able to get through to meet him."

Carlyn has been going to Egleston Children's Hospital since shortly after she was born, and the entire staff there knows her as a courageous, outgoing young girl.

When a member of the hospital's staff saw Carlyn waiting in line with her mom to see Pratt, she ushered the two to the front of the line for a chance to speak with the actor.

"He asked me how old I was and asked my birthday, and I told him I was 8 and that my birthday was Aug. 14," said Carlyn of her conversation with Pratt. "He told me that he had a son, and that his birthday was about the same day as mine, Aug. 17. And he said that he liked my eyes."

Carlyn was unfamiliar Pratt's work, but her mom said she's anxious to watch some of his movies when she's old enough.

As a keepsake, Pratt gave Carlyn a dinosaur toy from the blockbuster Jurassic World, in which he plays a velociraptor trainer. Perhaps even more special, he gave her his time that Saturday. "He took his time with

her, got down on her level, just gave her the biggest, warmest hug, and just was very real," said Jennifer. "I told him how much I appreciated him taking the time to talk to her."

Toward the tail end of her most recent stay at Egleston, after having met Pratt, Carlyn got a visit from Miss America Betty Cantrell, and she thought both Cantrell and her crown were very nice and pretty.

Last year, Derek Hough of Dancing with the Stars stopped in and took a selfie with Carlyn.
