Saturday will be the last chance to visit the Byron Herbert Reece Farm and Heritage Center until April.

On Saturday, A Christmas Open House will be held at the Reece Farm and Heritage Center from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m., the Reece Society has announced.

It's a chance to get an up close look at the center and all things Reece for free.

The Reece Society encourages locals and tourists alike to come grab some refreshments and enjoy the day.

Several door prizes will be drawn at  $2 \text{ p.m.}, \overline{3} \text{ p.m.}, \text{ and}$ 4 p.m., according to the Reece Society.

Also on hand on Saturday, Georgia author Terry Kay will be there to sign his awardwinning books. Kay has won four Georgia Author of the Year awards, the most recent one this year in the short story category for his book, The Greats of Cuttercane.

Three of Kay's novels have been made into Hallmark Hall of Fame movies, including To Dance with the White Dog, starring Hume Cronyn and Jessica Tandy. His books will be available for purchase, or you may bring books authored by him for him to sign, according to the Reece Soci-

The event is also a pretty good opportunity to purchase a unique Christmas gift.

A Union County native, Hub Reece, who died at the age of 40, farmed, worked and cultivated the land in the Wolf Creek bottoms.

"The Mountain Poet" spent his free time reading the works of literary greats, and writing prose about the Mountain way of life.

During his short-lived career, Hub Reece, who attended, but did not graduate from Young Harris College, was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize, earned two Guggenheim awards, and served as writer-in-residence at UCLA, Atlanta's Emory University, and Young Harris College in Towns County.

In his lifetime, Reece had his work published in the local newspaper, and later went on to compose four books of poetry and two fiction novels. His work, which included Ballad of the Bones

and Other Poems, was highly acclaimed, earning esteemed literary praise and national attention.

Other works included novels, Better a Dinner of Herbs, and The Hawk and the Sun

Hundreds of unpublished Hub Reece poems still exist today, Reece Society spokesman John Kay said.

Atlanta Constitution Executive Editor and later Publisher Ralph McGill once said that Reece was "one of the really great poets of our time, and one to stand with those of any other time.'

Hub Reece was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize for his 1950 work entitled Bow Down in Jericho.

By January 1951, Hub Reece had been recognized on the national scene in a

### Poandl allegedly molested 10-year-old boy 30 years ago in Union County

A Catholic priest formerly associated with the local Catholic church has been accused of molesting a 10year-old boy 30 years ago in Union County, the North Georgia News has learned.

Father Robert Poandl, 71, oversaw Catholic churches in Blairsville, Cleveland and Dahlonega in the late 1970s and early 1980s, according to the Glenmary Home Missioners' Website.

The priest was indicted Nov. 15th by a federal grand jury for transporting a minor across state lines with intent to engage in sexual activity. The incident allegedly occurred in 1991 in West Virginia, according to a release by Glenmary.

Union County Sheriff's spokesman and Investigator C.J. Worden said that an Atlanta man, now 40 years old, contacted the department about being molested here 30 years ago.

'In Georgia, acts of child molestation must be reported within seven years of

the victim turning 16 years old before a case can be prosecuted," Worden said. "We took the victim's statement, looked at every angle and knew there was nothing we could do.

'However, we did turn that information over to the Federal Bureau of Investigation," Worden said.

The incident was reported July 14th, Worden said. 'On that date, we received a call about an incident that happened at the local Catholic church 30 years ago," Worden said. "The victim was 10 years old at the time of the alleged molestation.

"The victim told us
