# Bandit brings holiday darkness

The Blue Ridge Mountain EMC has discovered the culprit responsible for the holiday blackout.

'We had a raccoon crawl into the substation yard (in Blairsville), and actually climb up on our facilities there," said Dan Brewer, interim general manager of Blue Ridge Mountain EMC. "It got between the high voltage line and probably the steel in the substation.

'That created a short circuit just like you would have in your house, and that short circuit tripped a breaker that we have, which is just like a breaker you have in your house.

The power outage occurred at 7 p.m. on Thanksgiving Day, and power was restored shortly thereafter at approximately 7:17 p.m., briefly interrupting family time and early Black Friday shopping alike that Thursday.

More than 3,000 individual service accounts were knocked out during that time, including Walmart, other local businesses and many residences in Blairsville and Union County.

"We had an employee who happens to live close to the substation, and as soon as (the power) went out he called in, and they sent him over to the substation, and he actually restored the service after he was able to check out what the problem was," said Brewer.

Unfortunately, the raccoon did not survive the encounter.

"This is not an uncommon occurrence," said Brewer. "It
