You can work on this at almost any time. You can assume a and can throw your swing into a balanced address position without a club and turn the core of your body to start the weight transfer to the back foot. (You will see good players lay their arms across their chest in an X fashion and turn to feel the center of their chest when working on their first move down.) Now focus on the exact moment when you feel the weight start its path to the front foot. Feel yourself push weight off the back foot and settle it on the front foot before anything happens in the swing including too much hip turn. If the lower part of the spine needs to move as the weight transfers then let it the front side first so the rest of happen. Just remember to keep the top part of the spine behind impact. Allow the arms to fall naturally and guide them with the top of the shoulder line.

I know this all sounds hard to do but it really isn't. Stay focused on your balance and a lot of this will take care of itself. Give your swing time to work in the proper order and the club weight transfer before anything path will be correct most of the time and that is pretty much all we can hope for.


